Church Of England Liturgical Colours

Liturgical colours are those specific colours used for vestments and hangings within the context of Christian liturgy. The symbolism of violet, white, green, red, gold, black, rose and other colours may serve to underline moods appropriate to a season of the liturgical year or may highlight a special occasion.

Coloured hangings are traditionally removed for Good Friday and Easter Eve, but red is the colour for the liturgy on Good Friday. Purple (which may vary from 'Roman purple' to violet, with blue as an alternative) is the colour for Advent and from Ash Wednesday until the day before Palm Sunday.

In the Use of Sarum, white, red, and blue were the primary colours; but in Lent an unbleached cloth was customary, changing to deep red during the two weeks before Easter. Anglican and Lutheran churches have in recent times generally followed the Roman sequence, although some Anglican churches have restored the colours of the Use of Sarum.

Some churches are simply bare at this time instead of using colours for symbolism. Ordinary time, where weeks are counted down between major seasons. Liturgical Colors and the seasons of the church year The use of colors to differentiate liturgical seasons became a common practice in the Western church in about the fourth century. At first, usages varied considerably but by the 12th century Pope Innocent III systematized the use of five colors: Violet, White, Black, Red and Green.

The liturgical or Church year is divided into several seasons. It begins with Advent, which looks forward to Christmas. The visit of the wise men to Jesus is remembered at Epiphany, after which there is a period of 'ordinary time'. The six weeks of Lent prepare us for Easter, which celebrates Jesus's resurrection, leading forward to his ...

For example, for Advent either Dark Blue or Bright Blue can be used if using Blue (many Protestants), or either Purple or Blue Violet are appropriate if using Purple (Catholic traditions). The exceptions are Holy Days in which White and Gold (or White and Yellow) are usually used together, with White being the primary color.

Colors of the Christian Church Year - CRI/Voice

The collects use the contemporary wording. The liturgical color appropriate for the day is indicated, when the color is green, red or purple, by the color of the numeral against a light grey background. When the liturgical color is white, the numeral is black against a white background. On weekdays, other than major Holy Days, the color indicated is the color appropriate to the season.

These are the colors of the Liturgical Year. In the Catholic Church, each season has a color and each color has a meaning. Here is the guide to the colors of the Liturgical Year and what they mean.

Colour: The colour used during the Easter season is White, signifying the joy of Christ's resurrection. The last day of the Easter season is Pentecost Sunday, on which we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. On this day Red is the liturgical colour, representing the Fire of the Holy Spirit.

The liturgical seasonal altar and vestment colours

In Christian churches one of four colours - purple, green, gold (or white) and red - referred to as 'liturgical colours', are used for altar linen, clergy robes and various hangings. The colour reflects the season, so that for instance in Advent purple is used, a colour of royalty because we are preparing to welcome the coming of a king.
