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Classroom Interaction Affected By Power

In this type of classroom, interaction between teachers and students or students and students are limited. On the other hand, in small Power Distance societies students interact with teachers and other students more actively and freely. Below, more details are shown, referring to specific studies by researchers.

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Contrary to the common assumption that the teacher is the source of classroom power, it sees that power as arising from the interaction between students and teachers. If power is owned by the teacher, she is completely responsible for events in the classroom, whether or not she chooses to share her power/control/authority with the students.
