For a key of C harmonica, the 5th scale tone is G (C=1, D=2, E=3, F=4, G=5), so playing 2nd position on a C harmonica is playing in the key of G (technically the G "mixolidian" mode). 3rd position, sometimes called "slant harp" or "double-crossed", is the scale starting another 5th up from 2nd position, e.g. for a C harmonica, D. (2nd position G=1, A=2, B=3, C=4, D=5.)

Positions on a harmonica are numbered 1 through 12. Each time you count up five scale steps from the key of the harp, you've reached the next position. The blow chord (C on a C-harmonica) is designed to be the harp's home chord. When players use the blow chord as home base, they call it straight harp, or first position.

How to Figure Out a Position on the Harmonica with the ...

Harmonica players began to experiment and found that when they primarily used the inhale (draw) notes, a different kind of sound was provided. This resulted in a new and more fluid style of playing, known as 2nd Position (Cross Harp). 90% of today's players use 2nd Position for Blues, Rock, Country & Pop music.

4th position means that a C harmonica plays in A minor. So, one of the root (or home) notes is the 6 draw, or 6D. Note: The TAB system is 2B = blow 2 hole: 3D = draw 3 hole. ' indicates a half bend, " means a full bend. Now, take a C harmonica, try a 4th position scale: 6D 7D 7B 8D 8B 9D 9B 10D
